Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The National League for Nursing named Regis a Center for Excellence in Nursing Education — we're among only 19 nursing program in the US to be so recognized. Unlike other programs in the area, the Regis Bachelor of Science in Nursing program offers valuable hands-on training in a classroom setting, student-to-student support, and personal support from faculty and advisors.

A BSN degree prepares nurses for better employment opportunities and professional satisfaction. The highly-skilled care a BSN prepared nurse provides has been shown to dramatically improve patient recovery rates.

- The RN with a BSN has higher earning potential then a RN with an associate's degree
- RNs with a BS degree may be eligible for six times as many jobs than those without a BS
- The majority of hospitals in Massachusetts will only hire BSN prepared nurses

Public Health is one of the fastest growing fields in the U.S. and offers a variety of career opportunities in the government sector, healthcare settings, nonprofit community agencies, industry, schools, research centers and more.

Public health professionals serve to protect and improve the health of a population or community. Public Health is about prevention, promotion, protection, and preparedness. It impacts healthcare by developing and implementing health education programs, regulating healthcare systems, identifying and monitoring disease, developing public policy, and conducting research.

An associate's degree in any discipline is required for admission.
